am pleased to present the 2023/24 Annual Report for OOHC. This year has been marked by several significant achievements in the Permanency Support Program, underscoring our unwavering commitment to creating positive, lasting outcomes for children and families in care. Through intensive casework, family support services, and

five children to their families, ensuring their safe return home. Additionally, six children were placed under permanent legal guardianship, securing stable, loving homes where they can grow with a sense of safety and belonging. One child was adopted, completing their journey to both legal and relational permanency.







5RESTORATIONS







Our carers truly form the heart of the Permanency Support Program. Their unwavering commitment to providing loving, stable homes profoundly impacts the lives of the children and young people they care for, helping them heal, grow, and secure the permanency they deserve. We are deeply thankful for their extraordinary role in shaping brighter futures for these children.

Creating Links has 177 authorised carer households, with 155 actively providing care for children and young people. This robust participation underscores the vital role our carer community plays in supporting children's needs and helping them move towards permanency. In 2024, we received 147 enquiries, with 55 households advancing to the application stage—a positive sign of community interest in supporting children in care. Of those, 27 households were authorised to provide care, further enhancing our capacity to offer stable, loving homes to children in need. Notably, 6% of our authorised carer households are Aboriginal carers, ensuring that Aboriginal children in our program remain connected to their culture, community, and traditions.

Committed to creating lasting outcomes.

This progress reflects not only our achievements in securing permanent solutions for children but also in expanding our carer base, which is essential to achieving the program's long-term goals.

A highlight of the year was the Client End of Year Event at Birrong Pools, where families, children, and staff came together to celebrate and strengthen relationships in a fun, supportive atmosphere. This gathering provided an opportunity to reflect on the year's accomplishments while creating a sense of community that enhances the care experience—one of the core goals of our program. Similarly, the Carer Appreciation Dinner was a standout moment, recognising the invaluable contributions of our foster and kinship carers. Their dedication and compassion provide safe, nurturing environments for children, and the dinner was a chance to express our deep gratitude for their ongoing commitment to achieving the best outcomes for children in care.

Engaging with the community through key events has been a cornerstone of the Permanency Support Program's efforts to support families and raise awareness about the program's objectives. Events such as NAIDOC, the Canterbury Bankstown Child & Family Expo, CBCity Families Week, CBCity's National Sorry Day, and the Matariki Festival provided valuable opportunities to connect with local communities, raise awareness of our goals, and build meaningful relationships with families, carers, and service providers. These engagements have helped us better understand the needs of the communities we serve and reinforce our commitment to a culturally responsive and inclusive approach.

Our carers form the program's heart.

One particularly significant event was our participation in National Sorry Day, where our team joined the community in acknowledging the history and experiences of Aboriginal and Torres Strait Islander peoples. This day was especially meaningful as we continue our efforts to reduce the over-representation of Aboriginal children in care by supporting family reunification and promoting cultural permanency. Our presence at these events not only increased our visibility but also reinforced our dedication to building trust and collaboration with diverse communities, ensuring our services align with their cultural values and needs.

Looking ahead, we are excited to build on this momentum in the coming year. By continuing to engage with the community through meaningful events, we will strengthen our partnerships, grow our carer base, and remain focused on providing stable, loving, and permanent homes for the children and young people in our care.

Foster Carer Profile



Ruth



"It's about nurturing, supporting, and witnessing the remarkable progress children make when surrounded by love." uth, a respite and short-term foster carer, has dedicated the past seven years to providing love, stability, and care to children and young people in need. Over the years, she has welcomed 10 children into her home, offering them warmth, guidance, and a safe place to stay. Ruth's journey into fostering was inspired not only by her own love for children but also by her professional experiences as a case worker with the Department of Communities and Justice (DCJ). Witnessing firsthand the urgent need for foster carers, Ruth felt called to step forward.

"I love children, and my son was excited about the idea of having another child in our home. My work with DCJ showed me just how important foster carers are, and I knew I could help," Ruth explains. For Ruth, being a foster carer goes beyond providing a roof over a child's head. It's about nurturing, supporting, and witnessing the remarkable progress children can make when surrounded by love. However, she acknowledges that progress isn't always linear, and there are times when the results aren't what she hoped for. "Sometimes, despite your best efforts, they don't progress. But I still find it important that they are with a loving family, where they feel safe and supported."

Ruth has experienced both joy and heartache in her role. Two siblings with severe behavioural issues left her feeling burned out, but many other experiences have been rewarding. "I've had so many fun respite weekends, full of chats and trips to the park. I've also been able to help long-term carers by giving them a break and helping their kids do things they usually refuse, like taking a bath or eating something healthy."

One of Ruth's most heartwarming success stories is with her current foster daughter. "She came to us with extreme behaviours due to unmet medical needs. By addressing those needs, showering her with love and attention, she has transformed into a sweet girl who is capable of so much more than anyone expected."

Ruth has found her experience with Creating Links to be particularly rewarding, especially with the support she receives from her carer support worker, Yslevy. "The support from Yslevy has been a gamechanger. She's responsive and helpful, which is exactly what carers need but often lack." Ruth also appreciated Creating Links' diversity and the employees from many cultural backgrounds.

When asked why others should explore becoming a foster carer, Ruth offers words of wisdom: "It's not for everyone. It's only for people with a lot of patience and love for children. If you have those qualities, you should consider it."

Fostering isn't for everyone; it's for those with patience and a love for children.

Ruth's journey as a foster carer is a testament to the power of love, patience, and resilience. Her story is an inspiring reminder of the profound impact one person can have on the lives of children, providing them with a safe haven during times of need.

Key achievements this year:

- Supported over 50 families and children, helping to prevent their entry into the child protection system.
- Delivered a variety of services, including early intervention workshops, parenting programs, counselling, and one-on-one family support.
- Partnered with local schools and community groups to broaden our impact.

Restoration Program

Our Restoration Program focuses on safely reuniting children with their families after being temporarily placed in out-of-home care. This year, we have provided comprehensive support to families to ensure successful and stable reunifications.

Key achievements include:

- Successfully restoring 5 children to their families.
- Supporting 23 parents in their journey toward restoration.
- Providing ongoing therapeutic and practical support to families to ensure they can maintain a safe home environment.
- Collaborating with child protection services to monitor and evaluate family progress throughout the restoration process.

Collaboration makes a profound difference in lives.

Community Engagement and Sector Leadership

Beyond direct service delivery, we actively participate in community outreach and sector leadership initiatives. This year, we were involved in several significant events:

Community Events:

 Our team participated in 16 community events, engaging with local families and service providers to raise awareness of our services and advocate for the needs of children and families.

Educational Partnerships:

 We strengthened our partnerships with educational institutions, delivering presentations and workshops at TAFE and universities to educate future professionals about child protection, early intervention strategies, and trauma-informed

ACWA Conference:

• We had the privilege of presenting at the Association of Children's Welfare Agencies (ACWA) conference, where we showcased our innovative approaches to family restoration. Our presentation was well-received, and we are now engaged in further discussions with sector leaders on potential collaborative opportunities.

Financial Counselling Services

This year, we have seen a significant increase in demand for financial counselling, reflecting the mounting financial pressures faced by many in our community. Common issues include the rise in payday lenders, mortgage stress, financial abuse, job insecurity, and unforeseen expenses.

Our financial counsellor provided vital guidance on debt restructuring, renegotiation with lenders, and increasing financial literacy, while also advocating on behalf of clients with financial institutions to ease the stress of financial hardship.

The Road Ahead

Despite our successes, we faced challenges, including an increasing demand for services amidst limited funding. The growing complexity of cases placed additional pressure on our resources. However, we see these challenges as opportunities for growth and continued innovation.

Looking ahead, we aim to:

- Expand our early intervention programs to reach more families in need.
- Strengthen collaborations with government, non-government organisations, and local service providers to streamline and enhance support systems.
- Secure additional funding to scale our services and ensure long-term sustainability.

Committed to empowering families for brighter futures.

As we move forward, our commitment remains focused on strengthening families and preventing child protection involvement through early intervention and support. We will continue advocating for systemic change, collaborating with partners, and innovating our approach to meet the evolving needs of our community.

Her first connection with Creating Links came after noticing a flyer for a parenting program at her children's school. The program, Circle of Security, was led by a Vietnamese staff member, which gave Celeste a sense of comfort. After attending several sessions, she felt at ease enough to speak to the staff member in her native language, sharing her struggles as a parent, wife, and individual. Through these candid conversations, Celeste was placed on the waitlist for our case management support program.

When Celeste was assigned a case worker, she was pleased to find it was the same staff member she had met in the parenting program. This continuity helped her build trust and confidence, allowing her to be more open about her needs and goals. She found the support invaluable, as the staff member provided guidance on understanding her children's developmental needs and strategies to support them effectively. The in-home support also gave Celeste a safe space to discuss personal challenges, including relationship struggles and the importance of self-care. Speaking with someone from her cultural background encouraged her to seek further support, including a counselling referral for herself.

Celeste greatly benefited from the counselling, which helped her build confidence in using English when necessary and emphasised the importance of self-care. She shared that this focus on self-care not only improved her emotional well-being but also enhanced her parenting skills. Celeste now feels more in control of her emotions and has a clearer understanding of when and how to seek support.

Additionally, Celeste became involved in our Parent-Child Mother Goose program, which has become a cherished part of her weekly routine. Her youngest daughter eagerly anticipates the sessions, and through the program, Celeste has gained a deeper understanding of how play contributes to her children's development. The program has also bolstered her youngest child's confidence and nurtured her middle daughter's passion for art. This, in turn, has strengthened Celeste's parenting skills and positively impacted the entire family.

Celeste proudly shared that, with all the encouragement and support she received, she enrolled in an aged care course and is set to complete it in December 2024. She expressed deep gratitude for having a staff member who spoke her language when

she first sought help, describing this connection as a turning point. Celeste likened the staff member to a mother figure and appreciates that Creating Links employs staff from diverse backgrounds and age groups, which not only helped her practice her English but also enriched her knowledge by interacting with different people.

In a touching contribution to our annual report, Celeste's middle daughter provided a family portrait, which was selected for publication. Her daughter was also recently recognised with an award for artistic achievement at school. Celeste attributes her daughter's success to the parenting skills she gained through Creating Links, which have helped her daughter's confidence and quide her artistic passion.


